

Year 5 Spring Term – 1

Maths	<p>Place Value: The pupils will be observing numbers using a place value chart. This will help them to read and write numbers up to 1 million confidently. This includes reading and writing roman numerals. They will also learn to round numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000 and this will also include decimal numbers.</p> <p>Calculation: Children will learn the formal methods of addition and subtraction as well as multiplication and division. This will involve solving real life problems and test style questions.</p>
English	<p>Genre: Film Narrative The pupils will be using a specific example of film narrative to apply a range of descriptive language choices and punctuation. They will be using specific skills such as writing with suspense. ?</p>
Science	<p>Living things and their Habitats: Children will compare and class different animals into groups such as mammals, reptiles, amphibians, insects, birds and fish. The pupils will be exploring a range of animal life cycles and comparing them with one another.</p>
LFL	<p>Topic: Ancient Greece Learning through: History, Geography, Art and Design The pupils will be explore the history of Greece and where it is located. Children will also have an opportunity to explore the atlas to find out which seas, oceans, countries and cities surround Greece.</p>
RE	<p>Caring for others, animals and the environment Children will be learning how different religions including Buddhism and Jainism care for their environment. Being Thankful: Children will learn the importance of saying thank you and the different ways religions say thank you. Being imaginative and explorative: Children will learn to appreciate the complexity of imagination and human creativity in worship.</p>
PE	<p>Please remember to bring your P.E. Kits in on a Monday and Tuesday. Your child will be developing their physical skills through: Handball – learning how to defend and attack, learning the rules of the handball game and the passing and throwing skills involved. Gymnastics: Children will create their own sequences of balances and movements that involve their partner and other apparatus. Children will learn how to carry and us apparatus safely.</p>
